More than 450 students who are in their fourth, fifth and sixth year in medical college attended the workshop, which was conducted by Dr Malik Zaben, Clinical Lecturer and Researcher in Neurosurgery, Cardiff University, UK. The training enriched the knowledge of the attendees about types of medical research, the difference between a research and a clinical audit, the optimal way for their conduction and the best style in reading and writing scientific papers.



ATLS Meeting / IMET2000 and PSA

On Wednesday 27th of September, IMET2000-Pal team led by Dr. Malik Zaben (CEO of IMET2000) hosted Dr. Fahmi Jubran (Chief of Palestinian Surgical Society) in a meeting at the IMET2000 office in Ramallah. The meeting discussed the progression of the ATLS project, and the next steps, which are going to take place to implement this project in Palestine including the upcoming provider and instructor trainings for the Palestinian team in Amman/Jordan early in November this year.

Nursing Critical Core Training: Airway Management Course

On September 16th, IMET 2000-PAL organised the Nursing Critical Core Training: Airway Management Course. More than 30 nurses working in Augusta Victoria Hospital, Al-Makassed Hospital- Jerusalem, Caritas Baby Hospital-Bethlehem, and An-Najah National University Hospital- Nablus attended the workshop. The workshop aimed to identify the structures of the upper and lower airways with their complications, describe basic airway devices and techniques to utilize, help nurses in identifying and how to do intubation, and using dolls to demonstrate intubation techniques for certain cases. This workshop was led by Mr. Mohammad Ata and Mr. Saleh Faraj/ clinical instructors in Airway management.
